

**THE UNITED STATES NAVY**

**PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE PROPOSED REMEDIAL ACTION PLAN**  
*for*  
**SITES 12 AND 14 AT NCBC DAVISVILLE, RI**

The U.S. Navy will hold a Public Meeting to discuss a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) and the Proposed Plan for Site 12 (Transformer Oil Spill Area) and Site 14 (Transformer Oil Leaks). Contaminants present at these two sites are Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs). The meeting will be held on June 17, 1993 at 7:30 p.m. in Building 404 (Administration Building) at NCBC Davisville.

The Navy evaluated the following options for addressing the PCB contamination of the asphalt, concrete, and subgrade soil at these two sites:

- 1) No Action
- 2) Deed and Access Restrictions
- 3) Sealing
- 4) Removal (With Off-site Disposal or Off-site Incineration)
- 5) Decontamination (Solvent Washing)

Based on best available information, the preferred option is removal with off-site disposal or incineration (Option 4). The Navy will remove the contaminated asphalt/concrete floor, 6 inches of underlying soil, and PCB-contaminated dust on other building surfaces. Contaminated material up to a concentration of 500 ppm will be disposed off site at a licensed facility. Contaminated material which exceeds 500 ppm will be incinerated off site.

Although Removal with Off Site Disposal/Incineration is presently the preferred alternative, the Navy welcomes the public's comments on all alternatives identified above. The Navy, in cooperation with EPA and Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management, may modify the preferred alternative or select another option based on new information presented during the public comment period; therefore the public is encouraged to review and comment on the Proposed Plan for site cleanup prior to the close of the comment period.

The Proposed Plan, along with additional documentation is available for public review in the Information Repository at the North Kingstown Free Library. Copies of the Proposed Plan will be available at the library. Library hours are: Mon. thru Thurs. 9 am - 8:30 pm; Fri. and Sat. 9 am - 5 pm.

The public may comment in person at the meeting and/or may submit written comments today thru June 28, 1993 to Mrs. Marilyn Powers, Northern Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command at the address below.
