Dear Mr. Crawford:

The Navy is forwarding responses to RIDEM letter, dated 29 April 1992. The following are the responses to RIDEM comments.

1. Comments 1 through 4 are on specification section 01560. This is not a job specific specification. It is a standard "boiler plate" specification used on all projects to tell the contractor how to avoid and prevent pollution during construction. All the technical information for doing the removal on this project is included in Division 2 of the specification.
2. Comment 5 is incorrect. The referenced paragraph, section 02095 1.4, states "all materials, except as specified otherwise, shall become property of the contractor". All the hazardous materials are "as specified otherwise". The material referred in this paragraph would be trees to be removed, grass, etc. Paragraph 1.3.1.4 and 1.3.1.5 clearly show all hazardous material remain government property.
3. In comment 6, the construction contractor is not doing the sampling therefore split sampling is not covered in the specification. The Government A/E Firm who is doing the sampling will split samples with RIDEM and EPA.
