The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) staff believes that the Pre-Quality Assurance Project Plan conference call on February 20, 1996, was very productive and helpful.

It is the MPCA staff's understanding that the Navy agreed to send the MPCA staff a copy of the meeting notes by February 27, 1996, and a draft Operable Unit 3 Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study Work Plan (Work Plan) by March 21, 1996.

As you indicated in our conference call of February 21, 1996, the Navy plans to include the seismic reflection work discussed at January 22, 1996, meeting in the Work Plan; however, the Navy does not plan to do seismic reflection under the main building. You agreed that some of the seismic work could be done during Phase I of the Remedial Investigation. We offered to schedule a conference call with you and your seismic reflection contractor to work out any details related to the field work and the Work Plan.
