Public Comment Period Open for Golf Course Landfill and the Fire Fighting Training Unit Remedial Action From Naval Facilities Engineering Command Midwest Environmental Department
The Navy, as part of its responsibilities under the Department of Defense Installation Restoration (IR) Program, has completed a Proposed Plan for the Golf Course Landfill (Site 1) and the Fire Fighting Training Unit (Site 4) at Naval Station Great Lakes. A public comment period for the Proposed Plan is scheduled from August 14 through September 14.
The Proposed Plan is a document that summarizes the proposed remedy on how to protect the community after considering and addressing public comments. The Proposed Plan for the site, as developed by the Navy and the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), recommends containment of the landfill waste and impacted material through the use and maintenance of the existing cover in accordance with State landfill closure regulations. Elements of the plan also include the use of institutional controls to restrict property and water usage and intrusive activities and the establishment of long-term monitoring of site conditions, including groundwater monitoring.
The Navy and Illinois EPA concur with the Proposed Plan for the sites.
Site 1, which is approximately 50 acres, was a landfill that operated from 1942 to 1967 and accepted a variety of waste from Naval Station Great Lakes. Material from the Base was placed in trenches then burned and covered with soil. The 10-acre Site 4 served as the Fire Fighter Training Unit for the Base from 1942 to 1989. Fuel oils which were stored at the site were used to ignite and sustain fires for training purposes there. Both sites, which are within the current limits of the 125-acre Willow Glen Golf Course, have been covered with soil for the 18-hole golf course that has been built.
As a result of past disposal and training activities, investigations encountered landfill waste and concentrations of contaminants in the subsurface soils, groundwater, surface water and sediments at the sites that exceeded screening levels. Due to these contaminants, the Navy has determined that risks for future potential human exposure (without restrictions) at the sites exceed acceptable levels. These risks along with the fact that landfill waste will remain in place triggered the need for the remedial actions presented in the Proposed Plan. No ecological risks were attributed to the site.

Comments should be written and should be directed to Mr. Hickey. Written comments must be postmarked no later than September 14. If significant interest is expressed and a formal written request is made, a public meeting will be held to discuss the findings and recommendations of the Proposed Plan.
