

NOTICE OF ESTABLISHMENT OF NAVY RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARDS (RABS)

NAB Little Creek will be establishing a Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) in an effort to increase public participation in the Navy's environmental cleanup program.

WHAT IS A RAB?

The RAB is a group that allows concerned individuals and groups to give advice to the base on its cleanup program. RAB members will serve as the focal point for the exchange of information between the base and the local community. The intention of the RAB is to bring together community members who reflect the diverse interests within the local community, enabling the early and continued two-way flow of information, concerns, and needs between the community and the installation.

WHAT WILL BE EXPECTED OF ME?

RAB members will be asked to meet regularly to review and comment on technical documents and plans relating to the ongoing environmental restoration studies and clean-up actions at NAB Little Creek. They will also be asked to attend all regularly scheduled RAB meetings. Members will serve as a direct and reliable conduit for information flow to and from the community.

HOW TO BECOME A RAB MEMBER

Base employees, residents, and community members who live near NAB Little Creek who are interested in finding out more about the RAB are invited to attend a community meeting involving several local Navy bases at 7 p.m. on May 25, 1994 at the Holiday Inn Executive Center located at 5655 Greenwich Road in Virginia Beach.
