
1. In November 1989, the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) listed the entire Newport Naval complex (NETC) on the National Priorities List (NPL) as a Superfund "Site" pursuant to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) Section 120. The NPL identifies those sites which may pose a significant threat to the public health and environment. Currently, five areas of contamination (AOCs) are undergoing remedial investigation. Six additional sites, referred to as Study Areas (SA), have been added under the Federal Facility Agreement, enclosure (1). Tank Farms 1, 2 and 3 located in Melville are SAs as defined in the FFA.

2. NETC leases a portion of its property to DLA at Tank Farms 1, 2 and 3 located in Melville. Because the leased property is part of the "Site" and is covered by the FFA signed by the Navy, the State of Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management (RIDEM), and EPA Region I (USEPA) on 23 March 1992, the Navy is required to undertake an investigation to determine the presence and nature of contamination at these sites. A Draft Study Area Screening Evaluation (SASE) Work Plan has been developed to define the level of investigation needed to assess the presence of any hazardous materials, the nature of any materials disposed, and the potential for releases of contamination, enclosure (2). We are interested in obtaining as much information as possible for conducting the SASE of Tank Farms 1, 2 and 3 which is scheduled to begin this year. Enclosure (3) is a list of information needed for the investigation. Request that you provide as much of this information as possible by June 26 and submit it to our point of

contact, Rachel Marino, NETC IR Program Manager. This information will be used to finalize the Draft SASE Work Plan that is being developed by Northern Division's consultant, TRC Environmental Consultants, Inc.

3. As discussed during reference (a), we are also interested in obtaining a copy of your Environmental Assessment and Remediation Work Plan for the Tank Farms. In accordance with the FFA, Section 30.1, any work related to the remediation at these sites must be coordinated with the Navy, RIDEM and USEPA.
