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PUBLIC NOTICE

The Department of the Navy, Naval Submarine Base New London (NSB-NLON), in conjunction with the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection, will hold a Public Meeting to discuss the results of the Remedial Investigations (RIs)/Feasibility Studies (FSs) and to present the Proposed Plans for cleanup of environmental issues under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) related to the soil at the following sites:

- Site 3 - New Source Area (NSA)
- Site 7 - Torpedo Shops
- Site 14 - Overbank Disposal Area Northeast (OBDANE)
- Site 16 - Hospital Incinerators
- Site 18 - Solvent Storage Area

The preferred remedy for Site 3 - NSA soil is No Further Action under CERCLA because the petroleum contamination found at the site is not covered under CERCLA and there were no unacceptable risks under CERCLA. However, the Navy intends to address the petroleum-contaminated soil under State regulations by excavation and offsite disposal.

The preferred remedy for Site 7 soil is also excavation and offsite disposal. Data collected during the RI indicated that contaminants in the soil posed unacceptable risks to human health and the environment.

The preferred remedies for the soil at Sites 14, 16, and 18 are No Further Action. Available information indicates that the soil at these sites do not pose unacceptable risks to human health or the environment.

Although these are presently the preferred remedies, the Navy welcomes the public's input. The Public Meeting will be held on July 28, 2004 at 6:30 PM at the Best Western Olympic Inn located at 360 Route 12, Groton, Connecticut. The public is encouraged to attend this meeting to ask questions and to provide verbal comments to the Navy on the remedies recommended in the Proposed Plans. Comments made at the Public Meeting will be transcribed and a copy of the transcript will be added to the Administrative Record for NSB-NLON. Complete documentation for the subject sites, including the RIs/FSs, Proposed Plans, and entire Administrative Record file, is available for review at the following information repositories:
