The Department has received and reviewed the draft Proposed Plan for the Rubble Fill Area at Bunker A-86 at the Naval Submarine Base New London in Groton. The draft Proposed Plan was received by the Department on April 16, 1998.

The preferred alternative being presented by the Navy in the Proposed Plan consists of No Further Action. Since all contaminated soils have been removed from the site, the State supports the proposal to take No Further Action.

In the second paragraph on the third page of the Proposed Plan, I suggest that you make the following change: In the third sentence, replace "The debris..." with "The soil...". This will clarify the fact that the excavated soil was also placed in the landfill.
