Dear Mr. Stroud:

As recently reported to your office by Mr. Jesse Waltz, Atlantic Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, oil stains have been observed near SWMU No. 20 of the current RCRA Facility Investigation (RFI) workplan for Naval Air Station (NAS) Oceana. Enclosure (1) provides a vicinity map of the base autohobby shop area illustrating the location of the recent stains in relation to SWMU No. 20. Based on our initial investigations, we believe the staining was the result of small spills that occurred during 1992, when oil products were transferred from the autohobby shop to a storage drum located in this area. Given the small size and nature of the release, there is no immediate danger posed to the surrounding environment.

As required by the RCRA 3008(h) Consent Order for NAS Oceana, we are submitting information on interim measures for cleanup of the recent oil stained areas. Our plan is to remove and dispose of the contaminated soil. The anticipated depth of soil contamination is 2 to 6 inches. Samples of underlying soil will be analyzed to verify the cleanup.



