Hi,
Tom thanks for the call. Here's the deal: If they remove any soil on purpose it is an Action. Either a Non-Time Critical Removal Action or a Remedial Action and they have to use Navy ER money. That means we have to go to the public, we have to do an FS/EECA, a public notice, and an Action Memo/ROD. If it is really of concern we could pursue this route and see where the Navy wants to go. From what Art said, it would have to get in the queue for funding. That means we're looking at putting it up for 2005 funding and the action might not take place until 2006. If you think it is really "de minimus" and you're not concerned with the soil concentrations as being any real and viable threat, the base can remove the debris using base funds. That means the barrels, cans and asphalt just going to a C&D landfill. No dirt. No sampling, no waste characterization. Not an environmental clean up - just a trash pick up. Let us know how you want to go.

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
