Tom Black (Public Affairs Officer at Naval Weapons Station Yorktown (WPNSTA Yorktown)) gave a Welcome/Introduction.

Captain S. W. Delaplane (Commanding Officer at WPNSTA Yorktown) introduced himself as the Navy Co-Chair and discussed the purpose of the Restoration Advisory Board Meetings.

Jeffrey Harlow (Installation Restoration Program (IRP) Manager at WPNSTA Yorktown) gave an overview of the Navy Installation Restoration Program.

Jeffrey Harlow discussed the election process for electing the Community Co-Chair. Jay Dewing was selected as the Community Co-Chair.

Brenda Norton (Remedial Project Manager Atlantic Division Naval Facilities Engineering Command) explained the purpose of the Site Management Plan and how it is directly associated with the Federal Facilities Agreement. In addition she explained how Removal Actions were successfully executed on 11 sites at the station.

Dexter Haven (Chesapeake Bay Foundation) was concerned about how the Navy was minimizing landfilling. It was explained that at WPNSTA Yorktown all efforts were being made to recycle or "treat" in place. There were exceptions, including the landfilling of zinc-carbon batteries at several sites that underwent removal actions.

The Community Members also asked about understanding the Installation Restoration Program and the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA). It was decided that this would be addressed in the next meeting.

The Community Members also expressed an interest in seeing the station. Arrangements were made and those who could participate visited the IRP Sites on the following Saturday (March 25 1995) agenda. The few members who could not participate were welcomed to come at another time (By appointment).

Also the Community Members asked if there was a way to "simplify" future documentation. Some changes would be made including sending out executive summaries.
