***RAB Administration***

- **Minutes:** The April meeting minutes were accepted as revised.
- **Introduction of new Commanding Officer:** Captain Bossio was introduced as the new CO of the installation. He stated his commitment to the environmental programs at NAS Cecil Field and opened the floor to questions.
- **Department of Defense Award:** A copy of the *Citation for Meritorious Achievement in Recognition of Outstanding Accomplishments During 1995 in Environmental Cleanup* was presented, along with a letter from Captain Bossio, to each RAB member as well as key support personnel to thank them for their contributions leading to the Department of Defense environmental cleanup award. In addition, Dave Kruzicki, Steve Wilson, and Mike Deliz received the *Civilian Meritorious Service Medals* for their key role in expediting environmental cleanup at the base.

***Lake Freewill Update***

Steve Wilson reviewed the closing Lake Freewill to fishing in terms of the pending health advisory. He stated that the BCT and the base want to be very confident about the safety of eating fish from the lake before it is reopened to fishing. He further pointed out that it was very important that the RAB understand the facts behind closing the lake because misperceptions and misinformation sometimes follow in the wake of newly issued health

advisories, (such as the one anticipated from the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services).

### ***The South Fuel Farm***

Eric Blomberg provided an overview of the environmental conditions at the South Fuel Farm as documented in the *Contamination Assessment Report for the South Fuel Farm*. (verify correct name of the report).

### ***Remedial Action Plan for the South Fuel Farm***

Tim Kelly discussed the draft *Remedial Action Plan for the South Fuel Farm* by presenting the preferred cleanup remedy for fuel contamination.

Skip Renkley, a former employee at NAS Cecil Field, recommended use of the air lines?? (or was it power lines?) available on the base rather than maintaining a fuel operated generator. This recommendation could possibly reduce costs, allow for a 24-hour day operation of the cleanup rather than an 8-hour day, and eliminate the possibility, however slight, of fuel spillage on the site. The recommendation was welcomed by the technical team and will be evaluated by ABB-ES.

### **Reuse Update**

Four people from the community attended last month's public briefing by the Reuse Commission. The community members who attended spoke in agreement with the proposed *greenway* through the base. The next set in the process will be to hold a Planning Commission meeting.

### ***Status of Basewide Initiatives***

An Environmental Baseline Survey for Lease (EBSL) was signed for the Yellow Water Weapons Area on \_\_. This document makes the property available for a lease of up to five years.

### ***Future Agenda Items***

CDR Jim Berotti of SouthDiv has offered to give a presentation on the budget process. He is available to participate in June.
