Dear Mr. Davidson:

I have completed my review of the Draft Sampling and Analysis Report Addendum for Building 1848, Naval Air Station Cecil Field, dated January 2005 (received January 11, 2005), prepared and submitted by Tetra Tech NUS, Inc. The report documents the collection of a confirmatory soil sample and its analysis for polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons. The soil sample was reportedly collected at the same location as a soil sample collected for the original Sampling and Analysis Report (November 1997) that indicated benzo(a)pyrene concentrations greater than the Department's residential soil cleanup target levels. This report indicates that all polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons in the confirmatory soil sample were below detection limits. Therefore, I concur that the site may be classified as 3/Light Green for the purpose of soil contamination. However, as the Site 57 groundwater plume underlies the site, the overall classification for the site needs to remain 5/Yellow, to denote an area where release, disposal and/or migration of hazardous substances has occurred, and removal or remedial actions are underway, but all required remedial actions have not yet been taken.
