I have completed my review of the Groundwater Monitoring Report, 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter, 1<sup>st</sup> Year, Building 81, Tanks 81 A, B, and C, Naval Air Station Cecil Field, dated October 20, 2010, respectively (received October 21, 2010), prepared and submitted by Tetra Tech NUS, Inc. The report is suitable for its intent and accepted as final. Regarding the portion of the isopropylbenzene groundwater plume that extends outside of the area that has a groundwater restriction implemented in a deed, the Department has determined that a Restrictive Covenant with the property owner would only be required upon the site receiving a Conditional Site Rehabilitation Completion Order under Risk Management Option (RMO) II or III (Chapter 62-770, Florida Administrative Code) for groundwater that would impose a permanent groundwater restriction on the site. As the Navy has not demonstrated that the site has met the conditions for the Department to agree with RMO II or III, the Department simply requests that the Navy keep the appropriate City of Jacksonville officials apprised of site conditions regarding groundwater contamination and monitoring well locations and request that the city coordinate any work they are planning in the area with the Navy and the Department.
