
The Department of Environmental Protection concurs with the Navy's selected remedy at the Oil Disposal Area Northwest and Sludge Disposal Pit Southwest, Sites 5 and 17, Operable Unit 2, Naval Air Station Cecil Field.

The remedial action at Sites 5 and 17 will address sediment and groundwater contamination, since the source, soil contamination, has been addressed under separate Interim Records of Decision. The preferred alternative includes the excavation and biological treatment of contaminated sediment and air sparging or *in situ* air stripping and biological treatment of groundwater at Site 5. The selected remedy at Site 17 is natural attenuation with long term monitoring from an established groundwater monitoring well network.

The estimated cost of the preferred alternative at Site 5 is \$1,052,000 and will take about 4 years to complete. The preferred alternative at Site 17 will cost \$232,000, and take about 15 years to achieve regulatory standards. We understand the responsible party, the U.S. Navy, will be performing the Superfund remedial action; so a State cost share under Superfund will not be necessary.
