Dear Mr. Glass:

The Department of Environmental Protection concurs with the Navy's selected remedy at Site 7, Operable Unit 3, Naval Air Station Cecil Field.

The remedial action at Site 7 will address risk reduction in soil and groundwater. The proposed remedy for soil is the excavation and proper disposal of 3901 cubic yards of contaminated surface soil. The proposed remedy for groundwater is monitored natural attenuation and institutional controls to prevent its consumption.

The estimated cost of the preferred alternative at Site 7 is \$705,000 and will take about 5 years to complete. We understand the responsible party, the U.S. Navy, will be performing the Superfund remedial action, so a State cost share under Superfund will not be necessary.
