Dear Mr. Glass:

The Department of Environmental Protection concurs with the Navy's selected remedy at Site 16, Operable Unit 7, Naval Air Station Cecil Field.

The remedial action at Site 16 will only address groundwater contamination, since previous soil contamination has been addressed under a separate Interim Record of Decision. The revised preferred alternative includes in-situ air sparging, vapor extraction, and treatment of extracted vapors to volatilize, remove, and capture contaminants from the groundwater in the source area and monitored natural attenuation for the downgradient portion of the plume.

The estimated cost of the preferred alternative at Site 16 is \$1,498,000 and will take about 30 years to complete. We understand the responsible party, the U.S. Navy, will be performing the Superfund remedial action, so a State cost share under Superfund will not be necessary.
