The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (Department) has reviewed the above referenced document, dated April 2001 for AOC 634 located in Zone G according to applicable State and Federal Regulations, and the Charleston Naval Complex Hazardous Waste Permit (Permit), effective September 17, 1998.

AOC 634 is located at former Building 1814, a 704 square foot flammable materials storage facility. Built in 1977 near the south end of Building 224 (a supply warehouse), Building 1814 was a chain-link fenced area with an aluminum roof, and was used until 1992 to store small (less than one gallon) containers of flammable material.

The 1991 RFA slated this site for CSI. Groundwater was not investigated at this site; however, the RFI and supplemental CS results indicate that there has been no release at this site. The RFI report addendum references applicable sections of the Zone G RFI report and addresses the required close-out issues as part of the NFA rationale. Based on the review of the above referenced report, the Department now approves no further action (NFA) as the final corrective action decision for AOC 634.

The Navy should note that the Permit has not been modified to document the above stated decision for AOC 634. The current Permit classification for AOC 634 is CSI. The Department will make the necessary changes to the Permit during the next Permit Modification to document this NFA decision.

To note, the Navy should satisfy all requirements of other program areas of the Department as deemed appropriate. Further, the CNC should note that the Department's approval is based on the information provided to date. Any new information found to be contradictory might require further action.
