The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (Department) has received a request from CH2M Hill, on behalf of the Charleston Naval Complex, for a "no longer contains" decision for contaminated soils excavated from a former dry cleaning facility at AOC 607. The soil contains tetrachloroethene (PCE) at levels which are below residential risk-based criteria (EPA Region III RBCs). The Department agrees that the "no longer contains" decision is applicable to the AOC 607 soil. Based on the analytical results presented by CH2M Hill, the contaminated environmental media no longer contains hazardous waste.
