

Naval Base, Charleston - The Navy begins implementing today the first stages of a plan to involve the Charleston community in environmental investigations being conducted at Naval Base, Charleston under the Installation Restoration Program. Copies of the plan are available for public viewing at two conveniently located Information Repositories.

The Naval Base, Charleston Community Relations Plan was compiled from information gathered during community interviews which were conducted in July and December of 1992. The survey included local residents and officials of Charleston and the Trident area. Based on responses, the Community Relations Plan was designed to address specific needs in the Charleston area. The results of the survey are included in the plan.

Two information repositories are also part of the Naval Base, Charleston Community Relations Plan. The repositories include information about environmental investigations such as site descriptions, program activities and findings. The repositories are located at:
