
Dear Mr. Magwood:

The author has completed technical review of the referenced document. As submitted, the report provides a narrative describing sampling activities, site conditions and analytical results of environmental sampling conducted to determine the extent and severity, if any, of suspected contamination associated with the referenced vessel and/or associated piping system. The results provided indicate that elevated concentrations of PAH compounds were detected in surface soil samples obtained proximal to the former UST pit. Provided this information, the facility recommends removal of contaminated surface material to eliminate potential risk to future site residents.

Based on the foregoing review, the author concurs with the conclusions and recommendations presented for the subject site. In this regard, the facility may implement source removal at their convenience. Subsequent to submittal and review of the final report detailing the proposed activities, appropriate consideration for closure of this site will be presented to your office.
