

Please be aware that the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control is currently developing designated Source Water/Wellhead Protection Areas for potable water supplies. In this regard, the Department is accurately locating (latitude and longitude) all known surface water intakes and public supply wells and generating reasonable buffer zones and/or wellhead capture zones, respectfully, as potentially environmentally sensitive areas for the water source. Concurrently, the Department is identifying and locating (latitude and longitude) all known and potential contaminant sources in relation to these developed Source Water/Wellhead Protection Areas.

With this consideration, this office requests your assistance in obtaining the appropriate DXF and/or DWG files for the referenced base. These files should present geographic information including base and site boundaries, sites, wells, roads, etc. Please be aware that this same information will assist the author in providing technical reviews and project oversight as the referenced base begins to develop corrective action alternatives for the varied contamination sites currently being investigated.
