The following data is submitted to you to be included in the lease agreement, by and between Naval Construction Battalion Center and Agent Chemical, Inc.,

We are going to construct a concrete slab 20' by 100' on which will be placed a Pilot facility for re-formulation (reprocessing) of Herbicide Orange. For this operation we will need a maximum of 300 amps., 220 volts of 3 phase electricity and a maximum of 7500 gallons of water per day.

The slab will be constructed by Roy Anderson, Inc., a contractor of Gulfport, Mississippi. This will be inspected by and will meet the requirements of the Navy. Roy Anderson, Inc., is fully insured by Lenwood Sawyer Insurance & Real Estate.

There will be five men needed to run this Pilot Facility. They are Dr. A. Beryl Gainer, Paul W. Lester, P. E., Frank H. Trifilio, M. S., Del Hightower, and Fay Burnett. They will be covered with liability insurance from Reiss Pleasant Insurance Company.

We will have four automobiles in use, one owned by Paul W. Lester, with insurance from Safeco, Inc., one owned by Del Hightower, insured with Hemer Insurance Agency, Frank H. Trifilio, insured with Farmers Insurance Company, and one owned by A. Beryl Gainer, with Ecco Insurance Company.

The Pilot will take a maximum of 90 days of in-plant operation.

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The equipment will be transported by three trucks from Houston, Texas, to the Base. These trucks will be covered with liability insurance. The same trucks will remove the equipment after the pilot is completed. There will be one fork-lift to load and unload the trucks and it will remain during the entire time of the pilot run.

After the completion of this operation, Roy Anderson, Inc., will remove the slab they installed and will leave the base in the same condition it was found, to the Navy's satisfaction.



