We are requesting that ABB-ES collect water-level measurements in four monitoring wells (locations are shown on attached figure) on a monthly basis. The purpose of the measurements is to track base-wide water table fluctuations. Fred Bragdon, at ABB-ES, estimated that the work would take three hours per month. Measurements were last taken by Mike and I on May 16, so the next round of measurements should be taken in mid June. The measurements should continue through the field work phase at OU3 and possibly a few months beyond.


