Meeting Minutes
Tuesday, August 20, 1996**

The regularly scheduled meeting of NAS Jacksonville's Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) was held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, August 20, 1996 at the Timucuan Elementary School Library. The following RAB members were present:

Margo Latham opened the meeting. The group voted to accept the minutes from the July 16 meeting.

I. Public Meeting Recap

Bill Dougherty provided the group with a public meeting recap. He noted that three community members (non-RAB) attended the meeting, and one of them did make comments and asked questions. Bill noted that the meeting transcripts will be available in the Information Repository by the next RAB meeting.

One RAB member asked about the signing of the ROD. Dana Gaskins explained that there is a hold on the signing due to questions between the State and the Federal Government regarding land use.

II. Relative Risk Ranking for PSCs

Dana Gaskins reviewed the Relative Risk Ranking for each PSC on NAS Jacksonville. He explained that the lists he handed out were based on areas they thought had the highest opportunity for contamination.

He explained that any site associated with the St. Johns River is given a high ranking if there are any levels of contamination identified through testing.

He also noted that the list was developed for funding purposes only; now they will go back to do more investigations for the high and medium sites on the list.

III. Operable Unit Three Update

Ann-Marie Weaver of ABB Environmental Services provided a brief update on Operable Unit Three.

She explained that ABB completed initial Direct Push Technology to determine where and what types of contamination are at sites. They identified 8 areas of concern or "hot spots" throughout the operable unit. Out of those 8 spots, two will be the subjects of an engineering evaluation/cost analysis (EE/CA): The West End Jet Line and the Old Engine Area. Removal action will be designed for these two sites. Two additional sites have been identified with single spots of significant contamination. These sites are the P-3 hangar and PSC 15. Wells were installed at those sites, and pumping will begin very shortly.

IV. RAB Minutes on Internet

Bill Dougherty provided the RAB members with two sample printouts of Internet sites for:

- Southern Division's Home Page
- NAS Jacksonville's Home Page.

Bill recommended that RAB minutes be made available on both home pages. The RAB

agreed.

A member also noted that some elements of the NAS Jacksonville Home Page needed updating.

A sample of the RAB minute site will be presented at the next RAB meeting.

V. Site Status Update

CHILD STREET AREA (OPERABLE UNIT 1)

Final Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study (RI/FS) is available for public comment. Alternative Three has been selected. The Proposed Plan is finalized for public comment and in the information repository until September 7.

LNAPL (Light Non-Aqueous Phase Liquid) Removal - Pumping of LNAPL continues; quantity of LNAPL pumped has decreased to less than 55 gallons per quarter.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT AREA (OPERABLE UNIT 2)

Monitoring wells have been installed to complete the additional verification sampling requested by Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

PSC 42 (Wastewater Treatment Plant Effluent Polishing Pond) - Bechtel Environmental is continuing in-situ stabilization. Work has resumed after the soil excavation from Bldg. 101.

NAVAL AVIATION DEPOT - NADEP (OPERABLE UNIT 3)

Direct Push Technology (DPT) samples have been collected at eight areas which have higher contamination than other areas. Only two sites have any significant areas of contamination. Removal actions will be designed for these two sites. Two additional areas have one point each that has significant contamination. Wells are being installed at those hot spots, and they will be pumped out for three days to remove as much contamination as possible.

PSC 48/Building 106 -- Work plan for air sparging (blowing air into the groundwater), and soil vapor extraction (vacuum of vapors from soil) is drafted, awaiting comments from regulators and Navy.

Building 780 -- Work plan for soil vapor extraction (vacuum of vapors from soil) and groundwater extraction (removing contaminated water from underground) is drafted, awaiting comments from regulators and Navy.

PSC 18 (Mulberry Cove - Radioactive Waste Disposal Area) -- All radioactive material has been removed. Area is fenced, and Navy's Radiological Affairs Support Office (RASO) is reviewing laboratory results of excavation. Area has been backfilled. When review is complete by RASO, area will be opened for unrestricted use.
