NAS JACKSONVILLE RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD
MEETING MINUTES
17 MARCH 1998

1. The regularly scheduled meeting of NAS Jacksonville's Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) was held at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, March 17, 1998 at the Timuquana Elementary School Library.

2. The February 17th RAB Minutes were reviewed and approved by the members.

3. Mark Reasoner resigned from the RAB due to job obligations. This was Captain Whitmire's last RAB meeting. He is retiring from the Navy.

4. **Operable Unit Two (OU2) Proposed Plan** – The draft of the Proposed Plan for OU2 is being reviewed by the lawyers for the Navy, FDEP, and EPA. The Proposed Plan will be ready for public review on April 1st. OU2 has six Potential Sources of Contamination sites. Interim cleanup actions took place at four of the sites. PSC 2 (Fire Fighting Training Area) still has free product in wells. PSC 2 was transferred to the petroleum program for further action. A public exhibit about the Proposed Plan for OU2 will be held on Tuesday, April 21, from 7-9 p.m., at the Navy and Marine Corps Reserve Center Drill Hall (U.S. 17 at the Birmingham Gate).

PSC 14 (Battery Shop) – This site contained lead, metals, and solvents. No further action recommended at this site.

PSC 15 (Solvent and Paint Sludge Disposal Area) – This site contained solvents and paint wastes. RI/FS began March 1998.

PSC 16 (Black Point Storm Sewer Discharge) – This site contained JP-5 jet fuel, oil, metals, and solvents. The site will be addressed in the OU3 RI/FS in 1998.

PSC 17 (Glass Bead Disposal Area) – This site contained metals. No further action recommended at this site.

PSC 18 (Fill Area) – This site contained radium paint wastes. Contaminated soil was moved to PSC 26 and the site restored. No further action recommended at this site.

PSC 19 (Old Gas Station) – This site contained petroleum. CERCLA no further action recommended. Site transferred to the station's petroleum program.

PSC 20 (Former Solid Waste Incinerator Facility) – This site contained solid waste ash and undetermined contaminants. Site screening study data is under review.

PSC 21 (Casa Linda Lake) – This site contained PCBs, metals, and inorganic chemicals. RI/FS is ongoing.

PSC 22 (Fort Dix – former skeet range) – This site contained lead shot. Army Corps of Engineers study recommended two feet of fill over contaminated areas if the station decides to expand the golf course.

PSC 23 (Old Skeet Range) – This site contained lead shot. Army Corps of Engineers study recommended two feet of fill over contaminated areas if the station decides to expand the golf course.

PSC 24 (Scrap Metal Disposal Area) – This site contained scrap metal. No further action recommended at this site.

PSC 25 (Building H2039) – This site contained contaminated glassware. No further action recommended at this site.

PSC 26 (Child Street Landfill) – This site contains landfill disposal materials. Cleanup scheduled for completion by Winter 1998.

PSC 27 (Ex-PCB Transformer Area) – This site contained PCBs. Cleanup scheduled for completion by Winter 1998.

PSC 42 (Wastewater Treatment Plant Effluent Polishing Pond) – This site contained sludge and metals. Interim cleanup completed. No further action recommended at this site. Closure report completed and Proposed Plan being prepared

PSC 43 (Industrial Waste Sludge Drying Beds) – This site contained sludge and metals. Interim cleanup completed. No further action recommended at this site. Closure report completed and Proposed Plan being prepared.

PSC 44 (Drainage Ditch – Ajax Street) – This site contained metals and solvents. Ecological sampling is underway.

PSC 45 (Building 200 Wash Rack Disposal Pit) – This site contained solvents. RI/FS is recommended.

PSC 46 (DRMO Yard) – This site contained benzene. Site screening data is under review.

PSC 47 (Pesticide Shop – Building 536) – This site contained pesticides and chlordane. RI/FS to follow.

PSC 48 (Base Dry Cleaners – Building 106) – This site contained dry-cleaning solvents. Interim cleanup underway. RI/FS began March 1998.

PSC 49 (Commissary Battery Charging Station) – This site contained battery acid and oil. No further action recommended at this site.

PSC 50 (East Side Waste Water Treatment Plant Sludge Disposal Area) – This site contained metals and organic chemicals. No further action recommended at this site.

PSC 51 (South Antenna Field Fire Fighting Training Area) – This site contained metals and solvents. Interim cleanup in FY 98. RI/FS to follow.

6. April 21st RAB meeting will be a public exhibit held at the Naval and Marine Corps Reserve Centers outside the Birmingham Gate.

7. Discussions:

Many thanks to Captain Whitmire for attending RAB meetings. His attendance and involvement with the RAB was most impressive and greatly appreciated.

John Barnard suggested that members come up with new ways to increase membership for the RAB and to come up with marketing concepts to help increase awareness about the RAB. The Florida Times-Union daily newspaper has a section in the Monday issue for public announcements.
