SUBJECT: Minutes for the Second Restoration Advisory Board

1. The second Restoration Advisory Board meeting was held on the 13th of April 1994 in Building 606 conference room located on Richards-Gebaur AFB. The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by the Co-Chair Mr. Powell.
2. Mr. Esch, the BRAC Environmental Coordinator for the base began the meeting by summarizing the status for each site/area of concern on the base for the new RAB members. The meeting was then opened for discussion on restoration activities at the base and community concerns with these activities.
3. Mr. Powell indicated that several aircraft crash sites may pose an environmental hazard today. Mr. Thompson, of the Corps of Engineers (CoE) made a note of these potential Formerly Used Defense (FUD) sites for future reference. (All sites not currently on Air Force property are investigated by the CoE). Mr. Esch made a note of the site located on Air Force property.
4. A comment was made during the meeting that past Air Force activities may have been the cause of recent fish kills in Longview Lake, and several areas around the base should be studied for possible contamination based on personal knowledge of past base activities. Mr. Esch indicated that all areas on Air Force property that were noted by the individual were currently under investigation. The CoE representative made a note of areas not currently investigated by the CoE.
5. Mr. Golson, of the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR), indicated that efforts should be made to include the CoE in a joint cleanup effort of the POL Storage Yard. The obstacles to this joint effort are the lack of information on the nature and scope of the petroleum residuals at the site. A joint effort would require an intense sample collection effort by the CoE to bring the site up to speed.
6. The scheduling of future RAB meetings was discussed. It was decided to hold RAB meetings quarterly and supplement the information flow with newsletters whenever items of interest to the RAB membership came up.

7. Mr. Esch gave a presentation on the environmental work planned for 1995. He indicated the priorities for each project and invited comments from the participants. The members did not object to the priorities or make any suggestions that shuffled the 1995 project priorities.

8. The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
