

THE NAVAL FACILITIES ENGINEERING COMMAND AND
THE AIR FORCE CIVIL ENGINEER CENTER HAVE COM-
PLETED A REVIEW OF ONGOING REMEDIAL
(ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANUP) ACTIONS FOR SITES AT
THE FORMER RICHARDS-GEBAUR AIR FORCE BASE,
KANSAS CITY, MO.

The purpose of the five-year review is to ensure that
remedial actions are providing adequate protection of
human health and the environment. The remedy for
groundwater (Operable Unit 2) consists of land use con-
trols (LUCs) designed to limit exposure to groundwater
contaminated with chlorinated solvents in isolated loca-
tions and long term groundwater monitoring.

The Navy conducted the five year review for Sites
SS003 (Oil Saturated Area and SS009 (Fire Valve Area)
and the findings of the five-year review for the Navy
were finalized on September 13, 2012.

The Air Force conducted the five year review for Site ST
005 (the Petroleum, Oil and Lubricants (POL) Yard), SS
006 (Hazardous Materials Storage Area), ST 011
(Underground Storage Tank 620A), and SS 012 (the
Communication Facility) and the findings of the five-year
review for the Air Force were finalized on 2 May 2013.

The remedial actions for all of the sites are protective of
human health and the environment and are anticipated
to remain protective in the future. LUCs prohibiting ex-
traction and use of groundwater are adequate to ensure
that exposures do not occur in the future. The LTM pro-
gram supports the LUCs and allows periodic evaluation
of groundwater quality to help ensure that the LUC
boundaries fully encompass the contaminant plume and
remain protective of human health and the environment.
Overall, COC concentrations indicate that the ground-
water plumes remain inside the LUC boundaries at both
sites, and there is no indication that off-site migration is
occurring.

The next five year review process will begin in June
2016.
