Dear Mr. Rauch:

On November 3, 1987, the Department responded to an oil spill and documented that the Trumbo Point Tank Farm, located at Naval Air Station, Key West, Florida is contaminated due to a discharge of petroleum or petroleum product. Information provided by the United States of America, Department of the Navy, demonstrates that the contamination of its property resulted from a discharge of petroleum product from fuel pipelines owned, operated and maintained by Key West Pipeline Company. As a result of this spill, over 400 gallons of JP-5 fuel has leaked through a seawall.

Based upon that information, the Department has concluded that immediate action is required to abate further seepage of free product through the seawall. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 17-70.006(2), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), you are hereby ordered to commence immediate product recovery. In addition, action to further define the nature and extent of this contamination is appropriate. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 17-70.008, F.A.C., you are hereby ordered to initiate a Contamination Assessment (CA) within thirty (30) days of receipt of this Order. This CA is to be implemented in accordance with Chapter 17-70, F.A.C. However, if this site is subject to a Consent Order issued by the Department or an approved local program, the provisions of the Consent Order shall be followed.

Within six months of CA initiation, two copies of the Contamination Assessment Report-Remedial Action Plan are to be filed with the Department's South Florida District Office, 2269 Bay Street, Ft. Myers, Florida 33901-2896.

This Site Rehabilitation Initiation Order (SRIO) is intended to complement and not supercede the SRIO issued to the Department of the Navy on February 2, 1988, for the above referenced facility.


Persons whose substantial interests are affected by this Site Rehabilitation Initiation Order have a right, pursuant to Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative determination (hearing). The Petition must conform to the requirements of Chapters 17-103 and 28-5, F.A.C., and must be filed (received) with the Department's Office of General Counsel, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400, within twenty-one (21) days of receipt of this notice. Failure to file a petition within the twenty-one (21) days constitutes a waiver of any right such persons have to an administrative determination (hearing) pursuant to Section 120.57, Florida Statutes.

This Site Rehabilitation Initiation Order is final and effective on the date of receipt of this Order unless a petition is filed in accordance with the preceding paragraph. Upon the timely filing of a petition, this Order will not be effective until further order of the Department.

When the Order is final, any party to the Order has the right to seek judicial review of the Order pursuant to Section 120.68, Florida Statutes by filing of a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400; and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal, accompanied by the applicable filing fees, with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date the Final Order is filed with the clerk of the Department.
