1. TRC members introduced themselves and Chairman, LCDR Mike Patterson, passed out the agenda for the meeting. The chairman also introduced the names and organizations of non-attending members and pointed out the list of TRC members provided in the designation letter to TRC members dated 1 December 1992.

2. The TRC Charter was explained by the Chairman and it was noted that minutes of the meetings will be prepared and provided by certified mail to all committee members. Member concerns may be addressed directly to John Garner or Chairman, LCDR Mike Patterson. Inaccuracies or problems with the content of the minutes should be forwarded in writing to the Chairman.

3. The Chairman explained legislation related to Installation Restoration Program and the history of the IRP and site investigations at NAVSUBASE, Kings Bay, in particular at the Old Camden County Landfill. We discussed anticipated subject matter for the next TRC meeting and Public Meeting, both on 17 December 1992.

4. It was suggested that Randy McCall of Camden County Health Department be a member of the TRC, attend some meetings or closely consult with the TRC since his office issues well permits and his input would be valuable. John Garner will contact him.

5. It was pointed out that the Navy had promised in the last public meeting that all who wanted their wells tested would be notified and their wells would be tested. Although this plan worked well overall, there appeared to be two individuals who were not contacted. This will be addressed directly with the two individuals involved.

6. Some wooden stakes are still standing in some peoples yards and they wonder if they should be removed. This will be addressed in the public meeting.

7. Some holes in the roads were not filled properly and need repair. This will be addressed with ABB-ES and during the public meeting.

8. The Consultant's data results from the interim corrective measure screening investigation will be presented and discussed during the next TRC meeting but the Risk Assessment will not be complete. A final Risk Assessment will not be complete until about April 1993. The report will be presented to the TRC and made public at that time.

9. It was suggested that soil tests be taken in peoples yards since the ground water has been sprinkled there for years. This will be addressed during the public meeting.

10. It was pointed out that sludge from Gilman Paper Company was deposited in this landfill and may be a source of contamination. However, the City, County and Navy also deposited waste in the landfill and the first concern is to remediate the contamination and worry about the liabilities at a later time.

11. It was pointed out that since vinyl chloride is not biocumulative, there is no possibility of ingesting vinyl chloride by eating fish in the pond. However, this doesn't mean the fish is safe to eat since they may be contaminated from other sources such as pesticides and fertilizer. This will be addressed at the public meeting.

12. It was pointed out that because of relatively short notice all TRC members were not able to attend. However, it was emphasized that full participation is necessary to ensure the best possible review of items presented. If members cannot attend they should attempt to at least send a representative so all issues may be fully addressed. All members not present today will be personally contacted and urged to attend the next meeting.

13. The formal Community Relations Plan is due for publication in January 1993. The formal Administrative Record is due in February 1993.

14. It was pointed out that some Crooked River residents are still using their sprinklers. It appears they don't understand that this is not advisable until all risks have been assessed. This will be

addressed at the public meeting.

15. Discussion on issues the TRC should review included addressing and making recommendations on problems such as economic impacts due to non-use of sprinklers, concerns about the effect on property values, etc.

16. A suggestion was made to add an additional member from the community to ensure an adequate addressal of public opinions/concerns. This will be reviewed prior to the next TRC. (Note: Mr. Bill Blankenship was identified as an interested community member. He has been invited to become a member of the TRC).

17. The meeting was adjourned following the Chairman's reminder of the next TRC meeting at 1330 on 17 December followed by the Public Information Session at 1900 at the Crooked River Elementary School.
