Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Cheryl Mitchell, Installation Restoration Program Coordinator, Naval Station Mayport. A list of attendees and the agenda are attached. Ms. Mitchell asked the attendees to introduce themselves and reviewed the agenda, then introduced Peggy Layne and Frank Lesesne of ABB Environmental Services.

Current Status of Investigations

Ms. Layne reviewed the history of the hazardous waste site investigations underway at NAVSTA Mayport, including the solid waste management units (SWMUs) identified and how they have been grouped and prioritized for investigation. She noted that the schedule for investigations is contained in a Corrective Action Management Plan, most recently revised in May of 1994. Field investigations were conducted at the Group I sites in early 1992, and at the Group II sites in early 1993.

Mr. Lesesne described the compilation of facility wide background information into a background characterization report and discussed the extensive alterations to the landscape at NAVSTA Mayport as a result of dredge and fill operations over the years. He noted that data gaps were identified in the background characterization activities as well as in the characterization of the Group I and II SWMUs, and that workplans have been developed to collect additional information. Field activities addressing those data gaps were initiated in May and will continue through August 1994. Interim corrective measures are planned to address PCB contamination at a site near SWMU 2, blasting media contamination at SWMU 19, and petroleum contamination at SWMUs 6 and 7.

Navy Environmental Leadership Program

Mike Davenport presented an overview of the Navy's Environmental Leadership Program (NELP). Mayport has been selected as the east coast participant in the program because it represents a microcosm of Navy activities, including ships, helicopters, and land based activities. The program is designed to test new and innovative technologies and management techniques to address the full spectrum of environmental issues so that the lessons learned can be shared throughout the Navy and Marine Corps. Representatives of all the major commands at Mayport participate in a steering committee to oversee implementation. Priorities include cleanup, conservation, compliance, and pollution prevention. NOAA indicated an interest in working with NAVSTA to identify conservation easements where appropriate. Copies of the overheads used during this presentation are attached.

Restoration Advisory Board Implementation

Cheryl Mitchell presented the concept of a Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) and discussed its implementation at Mayport. RABs are being implemented throughout the Department of Defense as a result of the recommendations of the Keystone Commission and a commitment from EPA and DOD to increase involvement of public stakeholders. The purpose of the RAB is to provide a forum for exchange of information between the Navy, regulatory agencies, and the community. The RAB does not make decisions on environmental restoration activities. Membership should be representative of stakeholders within the community, and meetings will be held at times convenient for public participation.

Some attendees expressed concern about the size of the RAB membership and the need to maintain a workable number of participants. It was noted that meetings with the regulatory agencies will still be required for decisionmaking, since the RAB is an advisory group only. Ms. Mitchell noted that the RAB for Mayport should be in place by the end of the year.

Copies of the overheads used for this presentation were distributed to the attendees.

There being no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned about 4:00 p.m.
