Dear Mr. Fraser:

Soil thermal treatment is a common treatment technology for remediation of petroleum contaminated soils at DoD facilities in Florida. I am enclosing for your information our Department's current policy for thermal treatment of soils containing low levels of volatile organic halocarbons under Rule 62-775, F.A.C.

Rule 62-775, F.A.C. may not apply if other non-petroleum contaminants are present in the contaminated media. In these cases the Navy may need to obtain applicable air permits and approvals from the FDEP Districts in order to use soil thermal treatment, particularly for on-site mobile units. Early communications with the Districts before project implementation are important in these cases. Please call me at (904) 488-3935 if I can be of any assistance on this issue.
