The department has reviewed your Soil Management Workplan, dated August 8, 2001, and has no objection to your proposal. The department understands that, based upon the soil sampling results, you have determined that the soils are very heterogeneous in nature and arsenic concentrations have a potential to commonly exceed levels of potential concern. As the project staff has decided that they cannot develop offsite agreements to address their concerns, we have no objections to their proposed onsite relocation plan.

We further understand that plan calls for the material to be moved to berms along the NAS Mayport airstrip. Mechanisms to address future exposure are to be addressed through an Individual Land Use Control Implementation Plan (LUCIP), in accordance with the August 31, 1998 Memorandum of Agreement between DOD, EPA, and FDEP.

Please send two properly signed/sealed copies of the construction certification report and Record Drawings ("as-builts") to my attention, when completed.

Also, as you note, the sampling results for the dewatering berm have not been submitted to date. Please submit these as soon as they are available. If you have questions concerning this matter, please contact me at (904) 807-3355.
