I am granting a RAA waiver for the small LUC by Bldg. 425. Should the scope expand, change beyond this LUC-only alternative, or funds become available to do something more aggressive to treat residual TPHs, you will be required to complete a full RAA. I remind you that every waiver request stands alone, therefore, related work but on different locations require another review. Please keep all this in mind as you move forward.

Future RAA waiver requests require the same data tag maps or figures, data tables (GW, soil, etc.), or other documentation to support your request without filling out the RAA template. Figures or tables don't have to be modified for the RAA request but can simply be pulled from existing reports to support your claim. However, any briefly written text should clearly document why your site should be granted an exemption and shall cite the back-up information provided.
