## **Description of Work**

Concord Environmental Services has completed monitoring well abandonment procedures on four (4) monitoring wells (MW-1, MW-2, MW-3 and MW-4) at the Naval Support Activity Memphis near Bldg 376. All wells were closed in the following fashion: 1) the monitoring wells were sealed with grout and bentonite (2-4%) using a tremie hose (up to 1 foot below the surface), 2) the uppermost 1.5-2 feet of casing, the flush-mounted protective covers and concrete aprons were demolished by jackhammer and removed from the well, and 3) the hole produced by the jackhammer was sealed and finished with sakrete.

No contaminated debris was encountered during the abandonment procedures.
