LCDR Ballinger, the Navy Co-Chair, welcomed the RAB and the community. Ballinger called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. and noted that there was not a quorum. Approximately twelve members of the general public were in attendance.

#### **RAB Administration**

**New Member Introduction:** Co-Chair Ballinger introduced a new RAB member, Bruce Hossfield of the City of Orlando Community Redevelopment Agency. Mr. Hossfield replaces Ben Breedelove on the Board. Ballinger then welcomed Capt. Douglas Yesensky, Base

Transition Officer for NTC, Orlando, to the RAB meeting.

**RAB Membership Recruiting:** Vice Co-Chair Di Silkwood reported on recent RAB recruiting activities. A letter soliciting new members was mailed the week of Nov. 6 to approximately 25 homeowner associations in the vicinity of NTC, Orlando and to members of the public who have signed attendance sheets at prior RAB meetings or otherwise expressed interest in the Board. Responses to the letters will be reviewed by the RAB in January 1996.

**Current RAB Member Terms:** Co-Chair Ballinger opened a discussion on the duration of the current community members' terms. She noted that RAB charter provisions call for members to serve through January 1996, but that a new slate of RAB candidates will not be established until the January 24, 1996 RAB Meeting at the earliest. The current community RAB members agreed to serve until new membership selection is completed.

**Defense Environmental Response Task Force (DERTF) Conference:** Co-Chair Ballinger explained that the DERTF is a Defense Department (DoD) panel that studies fast-track cleanups at DoD facilities and holds periodic public meetings. DERTF will hold its semi-annual conference in Orlando from January 23-25 and will be observing the January 24 RAB meeting. RAB members will be provided with the DERTF conference agenda and are welcome to attend.

**New RAB Business:** There were no new business items.

#### BRAC Update/Upcoming Activities

Mr. Wayne Hansel, BRAC Environmental Coordinator for the Navy, provided an update on ongoing and upcoming fieldwork at NTC, Orlando. His report is summarized in Attachment D to this meeting summary. Highlights of Mr. Hansel's report are presented below:

*New Study Areas: Former U.S. Air Force (USAF) Sites* - Eleven new study areas for former USAF sites have been added to the Installation Restoration (IR) program. These sites were identified and/or reported by recent record search activities and in the subsequent Technical Memorandum report. All of these sites have undergone preliminary screening except for five areas used as skeet shooting and indoor rifle and pistol shooting ranges. Most of the new study areas have been funded for further investigation, and field work is anticipated to begin before the end of 1995. Workplans for the investigations are currently being developed.

*Findings of Suitability to Lease (FOSL)* - FOSLs were finalized on four parcels. These include: Main Base Buildings 235, 236, and 238; Main Base Buildings 253 and 255; McCoy Annex Buildings 7236 and 7241; and Naval Hospital Athletic Fields and Courts. The first three parcels are being leased to the City's Community Redevelopment Agency and the fourth to the Orange County School Board. Notices of all the FOSLs were published in the *Orlando Sentinel*.

*Completed Reports* - The following reports were completed since the September RAB Meeting: Technical Memorandum U.S. Air Force Records Search; Site Screening Plan Groups I through V Study Areas; Final Group I Site Screening Report; and Draft Site Screening Report Group II. All of these reports are available to the public at the NTC, Orlando Information Repository in

the Orlando Public Library, 101 East Central Boulevard (downtown).

### **Questions on the BRAC Update**

**Who is funding the benzene plume investigation at Herndon Annex?** The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is responsible for the investigation as part of the Formerly Used Defense Site (FUDS) program (Herndon Annex housed U.S. Army Air Corps/USAF operations from World War II through the 1960s. If the Army Corps does not proceed with the investigation by Spring 1996, the Navy, as the property's current owner, will likely perform the necessary sampling and establish the source of the benzene contamination. A cleanup plan for the site would then be negotiated between the appropriate parties.

**Is the lead contamination above State limits detected by groundwater sampling at the Alleged Hospital Landfill (Bldg. UNF-12) confined to a single sampling location?** Yes, the elevated lead level was detected at one groundwater sampling location. Given that and the slight exceedance of State limits, the site requires no further action and is now considered transferrable. John Mitchell, the FDEP representative on the RAB, suggested that confirmatory samples at the location should be considered.

**What is the funding status for the Unexploded Ordnance (UXO) sites at McCoy Annex?** Funding for this work has been requested for 1996. However, the 1996 federal budget which includes DoD funding has yet to be approved. One factor affecting funding decisions is that the UXO sites are located in areas that are not considered prime transfer properties.

**Where are Study Areas 39 and 40 located and why have they been added to the site screening/investigation list?** Study Areas 39 and 40 are located in the southwest corner of the Main Base (the areas were located on a map in the meeting room). Investigations at three of the sites within these Study Areas have been accelerated because the City of Orlando has petitioned for early transfer on these properties. Decisions on whether to proceed with site screening at some other sites in Study Areas 39 and 40 will be made in consideration of current city reuse plans for those areas. Capt. Yesensky noted that progress in reuse planning and property transfer (as at NTC, Orlando) has generally served as an incentive for increased funding at BRAC facilities.

**What is PCE and is it a known carcinogen?** PCE, or tetrachloroethene, is a chemical commonly used as a solvent in dry cleaning operations. PCE has been detected in groundwater samples at Building 2817 (Recruit Training Command 1st Lt. Storage), where hazardous materials were handled. The cancer-causing effects of PCE depend on concentrations and type and duration of exposure.

At the conclusion of the BRAC update, Co-Chair Ballinger asked the RAB if the IR site summary distributed at each meeting should be provided prior to meetings instead. The Board approved, and felt that distribution prior to meetings would allow for more informed comments and questions. Co-Chair Ballinger then introduced Mr. John Kaiser as the new Project Manager for ABB Environmental Services. ABB is an environmental contractor to the Navy at NTC, Orlando.

**RAB Feedback on September Special Topic:**

**Presentation on Risk Assessment:** There was no feedback from the RAB on the special topic presentation made at the September meeting.

**Special Topic 1: Group II Site Screening Results**

Rick Allen of ABB Environmental Services presented an overview of the Group II Site Screening results. Group II sites are in Area C of NTC, Orlando. Area C is 2 miles west of the Main Base, adjacent to the Koger Business Center and fronting Lake Druid. It is primarily a supply center and houses the base laundry facility. Mr. Allen first summarized the findings of the Group II Site Screening findings. He then listed the specific sites to be discussed. These were:

- Cold Storage Warehouse (Study Area 11)
- Base Laundry and Drycleaners (Study Area 13)
- Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office (Study Area 12)
- Disposal, Salvage, and Scrap Building (Study Area 14)

Key items presented for each study area were:

- Environmental Concerns
- Summary of Investigation Techniques
- Study Results

Mr. Allen concluded his remarks by noting that Study Areas 12-14 have been grouped together as Operable Unit 4 at NTC, Orlando and will undergo a more detailed investigation. An interim cleanup to address contamination of immediate concern may also take place at this site. Mr. Allen entertained questions from the RAB following his report. The questions included:

**What types of interim cleanup may be implemented at the OU 4 site?** Potential interim actions include a pump and treat system for groundwater contamination and soil excavation and removal for soil contamination.

**Is it likely that contaminants at OU 4 have seeped into the Floridan aquifer?** A geological layer called the Hawthorne Group lies directly above the Floridan aquifer throughout the NTC, Orlando complex, including the OU 4 site. The Hawthorne is made up mainly of clay, sand, and carbonate material and is essentially impermeable. Therefore, it is unlikely that contaminants could travel from the surface down to the aquifer. Also, some heavier contaminants of the type found at OU 4 may pool and stay in place in soil and surface water, thus curbing movement towards the Floridan. Additional sampling is required to verify these conditions. Lake Druid will also be sampled as part of these upcoming investigations.

**Are there breaks in the Hawthorne Group which could allow contaminants to reach the aquifer?** Yes. A common example of breaks in the Hawthorne layer in Central Florida are sinkholes.

**Special Topic 2: Current Property Transfer Phasing Proposal of the Community Redevelopment Agency**

Bruce Hossfield of the RAB gave a briefing on the Community Redevelopment Agency's current proposal for property transfer at NTC, Orlando's Main Base. He stated that the new alternative would accelerate a three-phased transfer process already in place. The new proposal also distributes property transfers more evenly among the three phases, and reflects a more financially practical approach. The summary below shows the property transfer phasing already approved by the Navy and the City's new proposal.

Phase 2 (1997)	38 acres	192 acres
Phase 3 (2000)	562 acres	358 acres

Based on the specific parcels to be transferred and plans for their reuse, Mr. Hossfield said that the new phasing would require less demolition and infrastructure work, and also reduce environmental permitting and impact considerations. The new proposal has been presented to Navy and is currently under review.

The business portion of the RAB meeting was adjourned at 8:40 P.M., and the floor was opened for public questions and comments. These are summarized below.

**Questions/Comments from the Community:**

(Note: Questions and answers are paraphrased.)

*Are documents describing the new reuse proposal available to the public?* Yes, copies can be obtained by contacting the City of Orlando Community Redevelopment Agency at 246-3093.

*A member of the community commented that RAB meeting discussions and other available information on the environmental program at NTC, Orlando tend to focus on contamination and associated issues that have been identified. It was suggested that more information be provided on resolution of these issues.* The IR program at NTC, Orlando is being done in stages, where the execution of each phase is based on findings from the prior one. Resolution of contamination problems in the form of permanent cleanup plans occurs at one of the later stages of this process, and these plans will be publicized and subject to a public comment period. Until such time, the RAB and other community relations efforts such as the local Information Repository will keep the public informed of the current status and progress of the investigations.

*In general, how are BRAC activities funded?* Funding for the BRAC program appears as a separate item in the DoD portion of the Federal budget. These monies are then divided among all the military services involved in the program. However, funds budgeted for BRAC can be transferred for other purposes with Congressional approval. In 1995, for example, \$200 million originally budgeted for BRAC work was transferred to other areas. For the current Fiscal Year

1996, NTC, Orlando has an estimated \$10 million in BRAC cleanup work and has \$2 million in approved funding.

*A member of the community had heard some discussion that developers and the financial community were hesitant to invest in NTC, Orlando reuse projects, and in military property reuse projects nationally, and asked the Community Redevelopment Agency representative on the RAB to comment.* Regarding future development of former NTC, Orlando properties, the City will assure prospective developers of property transfer viability from both financial and environmental perspectives. In addition, the FDEP and USEPA must certify that properties are in compliance with applicable environmental standards prior to any transfer.

## NTC ORLANDO RAB UPDATE 11/14/95

### FIELDWORK

#### Group I ( RTC Area, Main Base)

- Group I Site Screening Report was given to the BCT on Nov. 8. Sites 8 and 9 require IRA for soils and RI for water have been made OU3 require remediation.

#### Main Base Landfill, OU 1 (RTC Area)

- Well installation was completed July 7 and development and sampling was completed the end of August. Results are looking good so far.

#### Main Base New Sites

- Air Force record search has identified 4 new sites in the Group I area and 4 new sites in the Nuclear Power School area of the Main Base which require screening. ABB has been tasked to start screening 4 sites which are in the NTC area and 2 sites located in the southwest corner of the base. The others will be screened with Groups IV and V and have been added to the FY-96 Budget request.(currently not funded)
- Two AST sites where the old Hospital Boil Plant was still need to be assessed.

#### Area C (Group II, Area "C")

- Draft Group II Screening Report was given to BCT November 8.
- Preliminary results: 1 Study area clean, 1 transferred to tanks and the 3 around the Laundry area will most likely become OU4( high level of PCE).

#### Hemdon Annex

- Army Corp will sample to determine if the old fire training area on GOAA property is the source of the benzene plume. The Army Corp has not made a decision on weather to fund the the project.

#### McCoy Annex (Group III, McCoy Annex)

- Analytical data being evaluated.
- The Draft Group III Site Screening Report should be completed in Dec..
- Preliminary results: Study Area 17 has Vinyl Chloride hit will need further assessment.

#### McCoy Annex (UXO Sites)

- Mayport EOD team will clear anomalies in January 1996 if funding is available (currently not funded).

#### McCoy Annex New Sites

- Air Force record search has identified 8 new sites at the McCoy Annex. The screening of these sites was funded with 1995 end of year funds. ABB has started on work plans. Some of these sites
