



TRANSFER OF UST SITE 98 TO THE INSTALLATION RESTORATION PROGRAM NAVY COASTAL SYSTEMS STATION, PANAMA CITY, FL

Dear Mr. Grabka:

As agreed upon during our meeting of July 27, 1999, I am providing the Department written notification that Site 98 will be transferred from the UST program to the Installation Restoration Program (IR) at the Navy Coastal Systems Station in Panama City, Florida. The transfer of the site to the IR Program is based on dissolved hydrocarbons being detected in the upgradient monitoring wells at concentrations higher than the downgradient wells, and volatile organic compounds not attributed to Site 98 being detected in the groundwater samples. AOC 1 is directly upgradient of Site 98 and is the likely source for a portion of the contaminated groundwater. The AOC 1 investigation and remedial action will address Site 98 groundwater contamination.
