Dear Ms. Martin:

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has received the revised generic work plan documents for the Naval Air Station (NAS) Pensacola. These documents include the Generic Quality Assurance Project Plan (GQAPP), General Health and Safety Plan (GHSP), Site Management Plan (SMP) and Project Management Plan (PMP).

Given the changes in RI/FS strategy and investigative approach which were agreed to at the June 16-17, 1992 Remedial Project Managers (RPM) meeting and the assignment of a new contractor to the project, these documents will no longer serve any function in the continuing RI/FS program at NAS Pensacola. EPA therefore sees no reason to either approve or disapprove of these documents. They will be placed in our files for documentation and reference purposes.

As discussed and agreed to by the RPMs, the new contractor will prepare and submit an Operable Unit (OU)-specific Sampling and Analysis Plan (SAP) for review and approval prior to implementing each work plan. The review period for the SAP shall also serve as the period during which the parties may revisit and resolve any outstanding issues regarding the corresponding conditionally-approved OU-specific RI/FS Work Plan. Once approved, the new SAP will replace both the GQAPP and the site-specific SAP contained in the conditionally-approved RI/FS Work Plan. Approval of the Final SAP shall also constitute final approval of the corresponding RI/FS Work Plan.

Regarding the remaining three generic documents received, EPA has already received a copy of the Health and Safety Plan (HSP) to be used by the new contractor. This will be placed in our files as the current HSP. Since review of this document falls under the jurisdiction of Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA), EPA will not provide a formal review of this document. The remaining two documents submitted (SMP and PMP) are not required under 40 CFR §300.430(b).
