Welcome

Discussed partnering - Ron Joyner gave the history of partnering from 1990 - 1991 onward. The idea is to promote communication and to get agencies and entities to work together. It has had notable successes and has fostered negotiation face to face around the table.

Presentation of Removal Action - Sites 30, 32, and 39 by Allison Dennen. Beginning with Site 39, which is stained soil south of camping area. Removal was by Public Works Department. Site 30 is a steel structure in the Wetlands. PWC removed it in a Level B protection. Site 32 is an abandoned waste water treatment plant. A sampling showed that the whole facility needed removal. Samples inside showed hazardous waste.

Presentation of Chevalier Field by Brian Caldwell. Site 9, 29, 34, 10, 14, and 36 posed the biggest areas of concern. Sites 10 and 14 can be written off with no remediation. The rest will be removed by construction contractor prior to 5 feet of fill and construction. The IWTP line will be clean closed according to RCRA. Soil was deemed to be non-hazardous.

Presentation of Pensacola Bay and Bavou Grande by Henry Beiro. Sites 40, 41, and 42 are the Bay, the Bayou, and the Wetlands. Ecological impact is very difficult to assess. The partnering team came up with screening values. Sampling has not occurred yet. Plans should be completed next spring with sampling to begin late summer or early fall.

Allison gave an overall Site Summary. There are 42 sites. 20 are RIFS sites. Site 43 will be added. (Drum Site near tennis courts.)

Michelle Harrison briefed TRC on Community Relations changes. Any facility that has a TRC must have a RAB, this is Navy policy. TRC is to propose slate for the RAB. It needs community concern, not technical expertise. A RAB is not a decision making body. Not all bases have Partnering Teams. Steps have been taken to generate community interest. Fact sheets have been sent to mailing list of over 100 names. Press releases and articles have run. response has been almost nonexistent. Only four indicated interest in serving on RAB and none were local. Will do more detailed fact sheet together with newspaper and TV coverage. 20 people at a minimum should make up a RAB.

Janice Kilgore commented on disaster information programs and the lack of community interest there as well.

General discussion of how to get broad based community interest generated.

Even if community interest is lacking, Michelle Harrison will continue to keep the community informed as to what is happening on base clean up.
