**DRAFT FINAL SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS PLANS: SITES 12 AND 26**  
**NAVAL AIR STATION PENSACOLA**

**COMMENT 1.**

The results from EnSafe's Phase I investigation should include detailed comparisons with previous investigations, such as **E & E's 1991** Phase I assessment. Comparison should include differences/similarities of sampling locations, sampling techniques as well as results. Note, the specific sampling locations and results from **all** from **all** assessment rounds should be plotted for each media on the same figures, if possible. Comparison between assessments is necessary in order to utilize **all** available data, facilitate document review, and to determine if a repeat of the Phase I assessment was necessary and cost effective. In general, with the present emphasis on remediation verses assessment, assessment repetition should be avoided if possible.

**RESPONSE:**

Detailed comparisons of the results of the Site **12** and **26** investigations with previous investigations will be made. Please note that the Site **12** and **26** investigations **are** not following a phased approach, and so the **data** comparison will be made when the fieldwork has been completed, and the results **are** presented.
