

PUBLIC NOTICE
NAS PENSACOLA
SITE 39 - PROPOSED PLAN

The U.S. Navy is proposing a preferred alternative of "no further action" for soil and groundwater at Site 39 on board Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida. Based on the results of the remedial investigation completed for this site, the Navy as the lead agency, together with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, believes that the "no further action" alternative is protective of human health and the environment. Therefore, the Navy believes this represents the best, most cost-effective response action for Site 39.

SITE 39 Contamination — including petroleum-based products, railroad ties, and construction debris such as brick, concrete, nails, and glass was discovered at Site 39, near the Oak Grove Campground. In July 1994, 864 tons of soil were removed and replaced with clean fill. Investigations of the site after removal found the soil removal action reduced risk to human health and the environment. A low level of contamination was found in the groundwater, but poses no risk to current residents. Drinking water for NAS Pensacola is supplied from Naval Technical Training Center Corry Station. As a result, the Navy determined that a detailed evaluation of other remedial alternatives would not be necessary and therefore propose a plan of "no further action" as the best option. Because low levels of contaminants remain in the groundwater, the alternative will be reviewed within five years to ensure that groundwater does not pose a risk to human health and the environment.

A public comment period has been established from MAY 30 THROUGH JUNE 30, 1995. The Navy STRONGLY encourages the public to review the plan and provide comments during that time.
