DRAFT RECORD OF DECISION, SITE 39 (OAK GROVE CAMPGROUND)
NAVAL AIR STATION PENSACOLA**

Comment:

Section 7.0, **Human Health Risk** Assessment: With the inclusion of the **inhalation** pathway in the calculation of Remedial **Goal Options (RGOs)/Cleanup Levels**, FDEP utilizes **1E-6** for carcinogenic chemicals of concern (COCs) and **1.0** hazard quotient for noncarcinogenic COCs as default criteria. However, if the contamination level of a Chemical of **Potential Concern** (COPC) is below the **ARAR (MCL, PRG, etc.)**, the COPC is not considered a COC, even if the RGO is exceeded. Therefore, **since** the level of arsenic detected in groundwater is not above the Florida **Primary** Standard (Chapters **62-520** and **62-550, F.A.C.**) the RGO of **1.3E-4** is not applicable.

Response:

The following sentence has been added to the text. The state of Florida does not consider arsenic a COC at this site because arsenic concentrations did not exceed a Florida *Primary Drinking Water* standard.
