Dear Captain Denkler:

The Department of Environmental Protection agrees with the Navy's selected remedy for Operable Unit 10, Naval Air Station Pensacola.

The Record of Decision specifies Excavation and Off-site Disposal of Soils in Area A; Leachability Study of Areas B, C, and D; Contingency of Excavation and Off-site Disposal of Soils in Areas B, C, or D should soils fail the leachability test; Groundwater Remediation under the Corrective Action Plan for the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) permit modification; and Groundwater Monitoring at Operable Unit 10 as a cost effective remedy which provides adequate protection of public health, welfare, and the environment.

The determination to remediate soil and groundwater at Operable Unit 10 is consistent with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) as amended by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) and the National Contingency Plan (40 CFR 300). Accordingly, the site must undergo a five-year review with the costs of the review to be absorbed by the Navy.

We appreciate your continued cooperation and look forward to an expeditious economic and environmental recovery of Naval Air Station Pensacola.
