**Welcome:** Greg Campbell, the Navy RAB Co-Chair, opened the meeting at 5:38 pm, and apologized for the short notice for the meeting. Each attendee introduced themselves and Mr. Campbell provided a brief summary of the topic to be discussed, the Preliminary Assessments of Munitions Response Program (MRP) Sites in NAS Pensacola, Outlying Landing Field (OLF) Saufley, OLF Bronson Field and Navy Technical Training Center (NTTC) Corry Station.

Lisa Minchew mentioned that the charter for the RAB may limit the NAS RAB to NAS Pensacola, and may not include the other OLFs such as Cory Station and Bronson Field.

*Action Item: Greg Campbell will review the RAB Charter to verify whether it allows the RAB to comment on investigations from the outlying fields.*

**Technical Presentation:** Susan Burtnett of Malcolm Pirnie, Inc. provided a presentation and summary of the results from the Preliminary Assessments done under the Munitions Response Program (MRP).

The informal presentation covered basic material, providing background information about MRP and how the funding and process works. Definitions, acronyms, programs, and data to be obtained were discussed. A description of

how the Navy decided to pursue further investigations of the sites was also provided. A copy of the presentation is attached.

Question: This is something fairly major, what is being done for community outreach?

Answer: We are presenting the preliminary assessment information to the RAB. It would be better to inform the public after we confirm the information obtained in the preliminary assessment with the site investigation.

Question: The community is very sensitive; could you notify the community before sampling?

Answer: Yes. We could have a meeting before sampling to inform the community of what we are looking for during the sampling event.

Comment: Before the Navy goes to do some outreach, let the RAB know so they can inform the community.
