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

Dear Mr. Kissam:

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has reviewed the Record of Decision (ROD) Amendment for Operable Unit 2, Site 2, Naval Air Station Whiting Field signed by the Navy on September 25, 2008 and signed by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), on October 8, 2008. The Department concurs with the selected remedy as written in the ROD Amendment for Site 2, which is no action (NA). Initially the Navy, USEPA, and the Department selected Land Use Controls as the remedy for Site 2 as documented in the September 1999 ROD. Since waste was left onsite, 5-year reviews were required to assess the protectiveness of the remedy. After the first 5-year review, and the finding that arsenic was naturally occurring and not the result of a CERCLA release, an NA remedy has now been selected.
