
RE: Final Remedial Investigation Report, Site 9, Waste Fuel Disposal Pit and Site 10,

Dear Ms. Martin:

I have reviewed the subject document dated January 1999 (received January 19, 1999). The document has adequately addressed my previous comments, with the exception that consideration of the leachability of contaminants from soils has not been presented. As we have previously discussed, this should be accomplished and may be presented as an appendix in lieu of a general re-write and table modification. Additionally, please submit a corrected Figure 6-4, showing the correct FDEP risk level and EPA risk range. This may be submitted with the appendix material pertaining to leachability. Finally, in future reports, please consider rephrasing the titles of the figures regarding risks from ground and surface water in that they are not properly termed "land use."

As soon as I receive the above materials, the document will be considered for final acceptance. If you have questions or require further clarification, please contact me at (904) 921-4230.
