Navy Assessment and Control of Installation Pollutants (NACIP) is the Navy's effort to identify and mitigate problems of environmental contamination at shore facilities resulting from the storage, use and disposal of hazardous materials. My letter of 17 May 1983 forwarded a copy of the initial assessment study for the Naval Air Station, Alameda and indicated that follow-up monitoring for Sites 1 through 7 would be performed as part of a confirmation study by the Western Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command (WESTNAVFACENGCOM).
