DRAFT FINAL, FOLLOW-ON FIELD SAMPLING PLAN RI/FS, PHASES 2B AND 3

The California Environmental Protection Agency, Dept. of Toxic Substances Control (Department) has reviewed Navy's Draft Final, Follow-On Field Sampling Plan RI/FS, Phases 2B and 3 and Navy's response to comments on the subject document. The Department does not accept the Navy's Response to the Department's Comment #13. The Department shall withhold approval of the Follow-On Field Sampling Plan for Phases 2B and 3 until the issue of Comment #13 is resolved.

Navy's response to Comment #13 states that a fourth monitoring well north of the building is not desirable and that this would not be down-gradient. At a meeting on July 28, 1993, the Department's comment and Navy's response was discussed. At that time the Department clarified that the requested well is north of Building 12 (not Building 400) and that it is down-gradient to Site 10A. The Navy and the Department discussed the placement of an additional well at this location. The Department still request that an additional monitoring well be installed at this location. The impression of the Department at that time was that Navy agreed to install the monitoring well. The Navy's response to Comment #13, however, did not change from what was stated in the original July 19, 1993 Response to Comments.

In regards to the Navy's Response to Comment #14, the Department would further request that the data from UST investigation be included in the RI Report.

There is also a discrepancy with the Response to Comment #20. In Comment #20 the Department requested that the discussion include SVOC contamination occurring at the surface in the southern section of Site 15. However, the Response stated that the discussion will be changed to include PAH contamination. Can the Navy please change or clarify this response.
