Dear Ms. Hornecker:

Based on our previous discussions and the attached e-mail message from Scott Kehe, OHM will modify our waste disposal practices regarding non-hazardous soil that is generated from CERCLA-related sites or activities. Previously this material was placed at IRP Site 5 as designated in the Final, Investigation-Derived Waste Management Plan (BNI, July 1995.) However, due to the concerns about sampling or excavation activities at IRP Site 5, OHM agreed to not send wastes to this site in late 1998.

Since that time the non-hazardous soil from IRP sites has either been reused on that site (where possible) or sent offsite for disposal at an EPA-approved, CERCLA disposal facility. To minimize the costs associated with the disposal of non-hazardous soil from CERCLA sites (such as the current replacement well installation program) soil that is identified as non-hazardous will be placed in the area designated by Scott Kehe in his August 28, 2000 e-mail message to Dhananjay Rawal.

All other waste handling procedures will remain in accordance with existing CERCLA Waste Management Plans.
