
Dear Ms. Anderson:

I am writing to confirm our conversations with your staff regarding a pilot innovation at El Toro. We have requested that EPA and the Navy utilize one contractor for QA/QC type functions for both agencies. This would potentially speed up the installation restoration process at this BRAC base, and demonstrates yet another example of our sister agencies commitment to work together to accelerate BRAC closures.

To further accelerate the process, the Navy is willing to grant EPA, as a member of the BCT, access to our CLEAN contractor for any QA/QC or other duties presently performed by EPA's ARC contractor. Further, we will allow EPA participation in the development of scope tasking our contractor with these duties. We agree that any products or deliverables will be provided to the BCT team in parallel with our internal review.

Given the above, we understand that EPA will remove their ARC's oversight from all El Toro work to allow the issuance of our tasking to Bechtel National Incorporated under our CLEAN contract.

With the above understanding, our contracting officer will proceed with our waiver request that is required to award this work to Bechtel. Please confirm in writing if you agree that this letter summarizes our agreement on this new pilot innovation.
